SPEED TRAPS



There are states where the speed is reduced for trucks. Most people are aware for example that the speed limit for truck drivers in California is 55 mph, however some states have turned speeding as their violation priority. That means more and more officers will conduct road side inspections and will stop drivers due to speeding infractions in these states as they have considerable resources invested in mobile enforcement.

The top ten states where you can expect to get pulled over for speeding are:

1. West Virginia : speed limit is 70 mph
2. Ohio: speed limit is 65 – 70 mph
3. Indiana: speed limit is 65 mph
4. Michigan: speed limit is 60 mph
5. Illinois: speed limit is 70 mph
6. Iowa: speed limit is 70 mph
7. Nebraska: speed limit is 75 mph
8. Delaware: speed limit is 65 mph
9. Idaho: speed limit is 70 mph
10. Tennessee: speed limit is 70 mph

Keep in mind however that there are some roads that will have a lower speed limit than the one mentioned above, be ready and lower your speed so when you're in the lower speed zone you comply with the law. That's where a lot of police officers will sit and wait for you to go by and then pull you over and give you a citation.

It is very important to get to that lower speed as soon as you're in it and be careful, you could have dangers like school zones with children crossing the road or intersections where vehicles are coming across. Remember, the best way to avoid a ticket or being pulled over in the first place is to comply with the law and keep your foot off the accelerator. Good driving behavior will save you fuel and costly attorney fees.
