TOO FAST FOR CONDITIONS



FMCSA defines it as "traveling at a speed that is greater than a reasonable standard for safe driving." You can easily get cited for driving too fast for conditions even if you were not exceeding the posted speed limit, because you could be traveling too fast for a certain condition present. Examples of conditions include:

- wet roadways (rain, snow, or ice),
- reduced visibility (fog),
- uneven roads,
- construction zones,
- curves,
- intersections,
- gravel roads, and
- heavy traffic.

You should always adjust your speed to safely match weather conditions, road conditions, visibility, and traffic. The faster you drive, the greater the impact or striking power of your vehicle. When you double your speed from 20 to 40 mph the impact is 4 times greater. The braking distance is also 4 times longer. Triple the speed from 20 to 60 mph and the impact and braking distance is 9 times greater. At 60 mph, your stopping distance is greater than the length of a football field.
